Memory Battles in Central and Eastern Europe: Changing Museum Landscapes and disputed ideas of human rights in post-communist countries

Robert Schuman, founding father of the EU, asserted that Europe should become a cultural union, much more than an economic alliance. After successive EU-crises, Schuman's idea is more topical than ever. If the EU wants to succeed, it should foster a European culture based on shared values. However, within the EU, debates on shared values, memory and human rights have proven to be difficult. The history of 'black pages', such as Holocaust and Stalinism, have remained contested. The memory battles should not be understood as an unbridgeable divide between Eastern and Western Europe, but rather as conflicts within the EU as a whole. Are we witnessing a conflict between neonationalist and cosmopolitan views? Should Western Europeans be more open to Eastern European perspectives and vice versa? Is there a possibility to bridge the divide? In this graduate workshop, we will reflect on recent developments in various memoryscapes in Central and Eastern Europe. We will discuss the experiences of German and Polish museum directors and focus on current research projects in the field.
